Prime Minister,

**Dozens of trade unionists
arrested on terrorism charges**

The Swedish Trade Union Confederation (LO), representing 1.7 million wage earners, wishes to express their strongest protest against the interventions by the Turkish police against their respective affiliates, i.e. the Confederation of Public Employees' Unions (KESK), as well as teachers' union Egitim Sen, which is in its turn affiliated to KESK, which took place in the early morning of Thursday 28 May 2009.

LO has been informed by union organisations in Turkey that the Turkish police invaded the KESK headquarters in Ankara and at KESK local branch offices in Izmir, Istanbul, Van and Manisa. More than 30 Egitim Sen members were arrested, including the following people:

According to our latest information, six unionists would have already been released after having their statement taken by the police. The others, however, remain in detention, and we understand that some of our colleagues have been

sexually harassed. The police has not given the reason for this operation yet, but according to the Turkish press, it was "set up in the framework of a bigger operation aimed at cracking down on the terrorist organisation PKK".

Furthermore, union documents and computers have been seized.

We cannot see this intervention and the ensuing detentions as anything else than antiunion harassment, which in itself constitutes a serious infringement of Convention 87 on freedom of association of the International Labour Organisation (ILO), which your country ratified in 1993. The rights of workers' organizations can only be exercised in a climate that is free of violence, reprisals or threats of any kind against their leaders and membership, and it is up to governments to ensure that this principle is respected.

LO firmly condemns this anti-union attack, and urges you to instruct the authorities to immediately and unconditionally release all the arrested KESK and Egitim Sen leaders and members. We also demand that your government respect and ensure fundamental trade union rights in Turkey.
